

The Gathering

This service follows the order laid down in Common Worship: Services and Prayers for the Church of England which was Authorised for use from Advent 2000. Common Worship allows for a great deal of local and seasonal variation in the services used.

The minister leading the service will guide the congregation through the service.

A Prayer of Preparation

Almighty and everlasting God, we thank you that you have brought us safely to the beginning of this day. Keep us from falling into sin or running into danger, order us in all our doings and guide us to do always what is righteous in your sight; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

The Greeting

Please remain standing.

Grace, mercy and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you and also with you.

This is the day that the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it.

We have come together in the name of Christ to offer our praise and thanksgiving, to hear and receive God's holy word, to pray for the needs of the world, and to seek the forgiveness of our sins, that by the power of the Holy Spirit we may give ourselves to the service of God.

Prayers of Penitence

The Minister uses a seasonal invitation to confession or the following.

Jesus says, 'Repent for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.' So let us turn away from our sin and turn to Christ, confessing our sins in penitence and faith.

Please sit or kneel.

Lord God, we have sinned against you; we have done evil in your sight.

We are sorry and repent.

Have mercy on us according to your love.

Wash away our wrongdoing and cleanse us from our sin.

Renew a right spirit within us and restore us to the joy of your salvation, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.

May the Father of all mercies cleanse *us* from *our* sins, and restore *us* in his image to the praise and glory of his name, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Blessed be the Lord, for he has heard the voice of our prayer;

Therefore shall our hearts dance for joy and in our song will we praise our God.

Blessed are you, Lord our God, creator and redeemer of all; to you be glory and praise for ever.

From the waters of chaos you drew forth the world, and in your great love fashioned us in your image.
